Follow The Feeling

Follow the Feeling is a fascinating and fun exploration of "all those feels" that music evokes.

Written by 2x Canadian Digital Accordion Champion Michael Bridge, students learn about musical mindfulness, identifying their feelings and pairing them with music, and using music as a force for good in the world.

Students get to make music themselves in the audience-choir, polyrhythmic clap-alongs, and a live arranging session—where their musical decisions come to life in real-time!

Dr. Accordion has performed for students in every Canadian province and 20 US states—and he plays a custom digital accordion, which sounds like a symphony orchestra, or a jazz band, with drums, bass, accordion, guitar, and outer-space sounds—all 100% live.

Origin Story

Michael Bridge began playing accordion at age 5, growing up in Calgary. His mom bought his first accordion for him at a garage sale for \$5. A family friend started teaching him to play. Formal lessons began at age 7.

He spent weekends at prairie accordion festivals, playing polkas and learning how to dance! At 15, Michael attended the World Accordion Championships as a spectator. For the first time, he heard classical accordion and fell in love with it. He realized he wanted to start all over again, playing a different type of accordion with buttons on both sides that would allow him to play classical music and study accordion at university. So, at 16, he spent all his savings on a button accordion, on which he couldn't even play Marry Had a Little Lamb. He enrolled at the University of Toronto and was soon playing 100 concerts per year.

Today

After studying accordion at the University of Toronto for 12 years, Dr. Bridge received his DMA (Doctor of Musical Arts) degree in accordion performance in 2023 (and became "Dr. Accordion!").

He has two groups, *Bridge & Wolak* and *Ladom Ensemble*. He performs around the world, and gives lectures at North American and European conservatories, and he teaches Music Business at the University of Toronto.

He has performed at the Metropolitan Opera in New York City, with the Boston Pops Orchestra, with the Canadian band The Barenaked Ladies, in Poland, Czech Republic, Italy, France, Brazil, Ecuador, 26 US states, and all Canadian Provinces.

Dr. Accordion's digital accordion is very special... It is a "computer shaped like an accordion."

Post-Show Activities


FOLLOW-UP GROUP QUESTIONS:
